PASTORAL REFLECTION



Today marks the start of fall, though the warm weather makes it feel otherwise. As we experience this transition, tensions in the world also remain high, and many of us yearn for a period of calm.

Today's readings emphasize the harms of self-centeredness. In the first reading, selfish people plot violence against a just individual. The second reading warns that jealousy and selfishness lead to conflicts and wars.

Jesus, while his disciples argue about who is the greatest, instead focuses on those who are overlooked and vulnerable. He teaches that those who seem the weakest can offer the greatest lessons in being Christ-like.

In the world, power often overshadows justice, and the needy are neglected. But as we interiorize the mandate to be "servant of all" and strive to be good leaders in the pattern of Jesus, we must turn to those of lowest status, embrace them, and bring them into the midst of the circle.

St. Francis frequently reflected on what he perceived as his own self-centered tendencies and sought to be like Jesus through prayer and meditation.

As the seasons change, we too can transform ourselves. Let us reflect, as St. Francis did, on our own personal selfishness. In the second reading, James gives us examples of "wisdom from above... first of all, it is pure, peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits, without inconstancy or insincerity. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace."



Forty Days on Mount La Verna

Two performances Saturday, September 28, 2024 • 7 pm Sunday, September 29, 2024 • 2 pm

800 years ago, St. Francis spent 40 days praying and fasting on a remote and rugged Italian mountain called La Verna. One afternoon while in deep prayer, he had an extraordinary mystical vision and following that encounter, his companions began to notice marks on his hands, feet, and side resembling the wounds of Christ. The musical event QUARANTA GIORNI explores the stories that led Francis to La Verna in the first place, and the legends of what happened on the mountain, as well as what followed that transformative experience.

"The Transitus"

The memorial of the passing of St. Francis Celebrated on Thursday, October 3, 2024 at 7 pm.

Each year, lovers of St. Francis from all over the world gather to commemorate a touching event in his remarkable life. It is called the *TRANSITUS* — that is, his passage (or transition) from earthly life to everlasting life. Francis died on the evening of October 3, just as the brothers were singing.

The Transitus uniquely celebrates our Franciscan identity by rooting ourselves ritually both in sacred Scripture and the historical foundations of the *brotherhood*. Saint Francis is rumored to have had a "sweet tooth"...Lady Jacoba used to bake almond cookies as a gift for him. In fact, she brought them to him the night he died. To celebrate that sweet memory, each year we have

a dessert potluck by the Casa poolside after the Transitus service. All are invited to bring something sweet to share!

In two weeks, we will celebrate the Feast of Saint Francis

As we have come to know, Saint Francis of Assisi was a man with keen vision, exquisite sensitivity, a great heart, and a deep conviction of eternal values. Certainly he was someone deserving of a great celebration of his gift to the world. Please come and join with the friars and the Casa community to celebrate his life and inspiration! Even though his Feast day is October 4, we will celebrate on the following Sunday:
