PASTORAL REFLECTION



Our first reading this Sunday warns us against relying on human power. Those who do so are like barren desert bushes, struggling to survive. But those who trust in the Lord are like trees planted by water, drawing life from God.

It's easy to think we're in control. But every day, we place our trust in others—without even realizing it. When we ride in someone else's car or on a plane, we put our lives in their hands. We don't dwell on it because if we did, we might drive ourselves crazy trying to control everything.

This truth hit me in a new way recently when my sister and her family visited. For the first time, we all rode in a Waymo. There we were, sitting in a car with no driver, trusting...well, trusting in what, exactly? It was unsettling (but also pretty exciting!) That experience made me think—if I can sit in a driverless car and trust a machine, how much more should I trust the God who created me?

Jesus echoes this lesson in today's Gospel. He blesses those who trust in God despite hardships, and he warns against seeking security in wealth or praise. True security is found in God. We all long for affirmation and sometimes seek the praise of others. What areas of our lives do we need to surrender to the Lord's control? This week, let's choose to trust in the Lord, not in fleeting comforts or praise. When we do, we will be like that tree planted by water—strong, secure, and full of life.

Mass with the Anointing of the Sick Saturday, February 22 at 10:30 am

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick seeks physical healing if it is God's will, but its primary purpose is spiritual healing, giving the sick person peace and courage through the Holy Spirit to face the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

Black History Month & Liturgy

Doris Akers (1923–1995) was a biracial African-American gospel music composer, arranger, and singer, regarded as one of the most underrated gospel composers of the 20th century. She wrote over 500 songs and gained recognition for her work with the Sky Pilot Choir, an integrated choir featured on recordings, television shows, and radio broadcasts nationwide during the 1950s.

Doris received numerous awards, including Gospel Music Composer of the Year in 1960 and 1961, and was honored by the Smithsonian Institution as the foremost Black gospel songwriter in the United States. She co-wrote and recorded the hit song "Lord, Don't Move the Mountain" with Mahalia Jackson, which sold over a million copies. Her songs were also recorded by artists such as Aretha Franklin and Inez Andrews.

In 2001, Doris Akers was posthumously inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame. Today, we sing her hymn "Lead Me, Guide Me" in celebration of Black History Month, observed each February, honoring the achievements and history of African Americans, highlighting their contributions to society and the ongoing struggle for racial equality.



Hope: Gift and Duty

As a church, we are in the Jubilee Year of hope. Pope Francis tells us that hope is both a **gift** and a **duty**. He tells us that "hoping is waiting for something that has

already been given to us: salvation in God's eternal and infinite love."

In this Jubilee Year, we are invited to be *pilgrims of hope*. We have been given the gifts necessary for the moment, we only need to "do whatever he tells you." And whether we understand it or not, God will work out the rest.

What kind of hope do you have?
Are they big hopes? Or small whispers?
Are they a secret? Or do you share them publicly?
Are they hidden treasures, barely expressable?
Are they tender echoes of old hopes nearly gone?
Are they seeds...or fully blossomed?

If hope is both **gift and duty**, what does that mean? Consider other things that are both **gift and duty**:

Parenthood, Faith, Freedom, Leadership,
Love, Citizenship, Health, Education,
Friendship, Nature, Talent ...

All these *gifts* enrich our lives and inspire us, yet they also call us to *duty*: responsibility, requiring care, integrity, and a commitment to nurture and uphold what has been entrusted to us. Duty is an obligation to act in a certain way, guided by values that reflect a commitment to responsibilities that often benefit others or the greater good.

Then, what is hope calling you to do? You've been given the gift of hope. What now is your duty?

Franciscan Immersion Trip through the Lens of the Provincial Synod Priorities

Last month, I was honored to attend an Immersion Experience for Franciscan staff members at the San Solano Missions in Topawa, AZ. Father James, formerly a friar at the Casa, is now officiating there, along with Father John Gibbons and two brothers.

Earlier in January, many Franciscans met at a national provincial synod. The resulting report lists eight priorities, many of which have accompanying actions. I was interested to see that several of the priorities were put into action as I attended the four-day immersion trip in Topawa. Here's one:

(Priority 2) The Gospel compels us to respond to the needs of the poor, marginalized (including women), and vulnerable persons, and our common home. We learned that the four friars travel for hours to make trips to minister to residents of the Tohono O'odham nation—the expansive reservation across southern Arizona that is their region. Just the fact that they live on a reservation means the O'odham are marginalized. Many of them are vulnerable. Most are also Catholic. The dedication of these friars and their committed volunteer support ministers is above and beyond.




