PASTORAL REFLECTION



This week's Gospel, as with the last several weeks, reinforces Jesus' teachings on faith and its importance to our spirituality. I resonated deeply with this particular Gospel. As a parent, I empathize with Jairus and his desperation to seek help for his

sick daughter from Jesus. As a parent with children who have chronic illnesses, I am even more moved by the astonishing miracle of Jesus raising Jairus' daughter after others had declared her dead.

However, what intrigues me the most is Jairus' unwavering faith in this story. He believed so completely in the power of God that he left his dying daughter to seek Jesus and asked for his help. He believed so strongly that he threw himself at Jesus' feet and begged our Lord to lay his hands upon the girl so that she "may get well and live."

Just four months ago, I sat by my own daughter's bedside in a hospital room, fearing that she might die that night. I remember desperately praying to our Lord, just as Jairus did that day, asking for His intervention. My prayers were answered, as were Jairus'. However, I can't help but wonder if I would have had the faith and strength to get up, leave my daughter's bedside, and seek Jesus out in person as Jairus did. Faith, no matter how robust, has the potential to grow even stronger. How might you cultivate and bolster your own faith in the coming week?

In 2004, our Blessed Sacrament Chapel was dedicated in honor of St. Clare of Assisi through a generous gift from Jacqleen Ferrell.

(This is the conclusion of a five-week series.)

St. Clare, through her dedication, became a light to the entire Church. On the occasion of her canonization on August 15, 1255 (just two years after she died), Pope Alexander IV praised her in words which still ring true. Even her name Chiara, which in Italian means light, became a vehicle for praise of God, just as Clare had dedicated her life to praise. The pope said:

"Clare shines brilliantly; brilliant by her bright merits, by the brightness of her great glory in heaven.

In this Clare, a clear mirror of example, has been given to this world; through this Clare, obvious remedies are felt here on earth.

O how great is the power of this light and how intense is the brilliance of its illumination!

While this light remained in a hidden enclosure, it emitted sparkling rays outside.

Hidden within, she extended herself abroad. Clare was silent, yet her reputation became widespread.

A light so enkindled, so illuminating, could not be kept from shining brilliantly and giving a clear light in the house of the Lord."
