PASTORAL REFLECTION



Matthew's Gospel tells us that when Joseph discovered Mary's pregnancy, he initially decided to "divorce her quietly." Yet, after an angel appeared to him in a dream, instructing him to take Mary as his wife, he obeyed. Although Mary was conceived without sin and had already

accepted God's will when she said "yes" to the Angel Gabriel at the Annunciation, she was still a young girl from a devout family in first-century Palestine. As she pondered the mystery of her pregnancy, we might wonder: Was she scared?

The journey from Nazareth to Elizabeth's home in the hill country was about 90 miles. Did Mary fear scandal or want to avoid judgment from those who couldn't understand her role in salvation history? Was she worried about how others would perceive her pregnancy? Did she fear rejection or misunderstanding, even from her relative, Elizabeth? These questions remind us that Mary's journey likely involved vulnerability and uncertainty.

However, we hear in today's gospel from Luke, when Mary reaches Elizabeth, there is only joy-mutual joy. Both women have experienced miraculous pregnancies: Elizabeth's after years of barrenness and Mary's through divine conception. Their pregnancies are testaments to God's intervention and power. Mary's journey to Elizabeth is not just a physical one; it brings God's presence into the lives of all she encounters.

Our journey of Advent is one of anticipation, preparation, and trust, but also perhaps anxiety and stress. Just as Mary said "yes" to God's plan for her life, we, too, are invited to trust in His plan for our own lives. It calls us to examine where we might need to let go of distractions, embrace vulnerability, and open ourselves more fully to God's presence. This season often brings personal struggles, family tensions, and the busyness of the holidays. Yet, in the midst of these challenges, we can draw strength from Mary's example and her joy. She trusted God even when the path was unclear, and through faith, the world was transformed.



Resilient Warrior Retreat for Military Veterans

I've been blessed to lead Military Veteran Pilgrimages to Assisi with Fr. Conrad Targonski, OFM since 2011. While at the Casa in 2013 for our yearly pilgrimage planning meeting, we were asked by the Casa Veterans Ministry to lead retreats there. From the moment of its inception, we strove to bring a piece of Assisi into these works. By far, it's the profound sense of peace in the hometown of St. Francis we hoped to share.

I have been deeply humbled by the men and women who have participated in the Resilient Warrior Retreats over the years. The stories they have shared along with the service they have performed in their lives is inspirational. The thread of faith throughout it all, of some who have been disquieted by war, is notable. It ties together a ministry that gives back a hundredfold.

As part of the retreat, we look at the life of St. Francis through the lens of a military veteran who transcended the scars of war, leaving a legacy of peace behind in its wake. It's a paradox worth deeper exploration for any trials our lives confront: Jesus in our midst even when we are blinded by dark circumstances.

I would be remiss to overlook the real rockstar of the retreat. Father Conrad was a chaplain to the Marines in Fallujah during some of the fiercest battles of the Iraqi War. He continues the legacy St. Francis began 800 years ago. If you are a veteran or active-duty, please join us on our next Resilient Warrior Retreat on February 21–23.


